



Frequently Asked Questions

1. Why is the PTA going electronic?

It will save money; we also save a lot of volunteer hours due to reduced hours at the copy machine! It's the future; you get the information as soon as it is available. Most schools in the Snoqualmie Valley are moving that way.

2. What kind of information I am going to receive?

You will only receive PTA related information. Specifically, PTA newsletters and PTA e-mail updates. All information is current PTA info relating to what is happening at Opstad, our school district and the OES & District PTA's.

3. I am worried about my privacy. What can I expect from the Opstad PTA?

We take your privacy very seriously. We will only use your e-mail to send you Newsletters and PTA e-mail updates. We will not sell your information to any company, school, etc.

4. Can I unsubscribe to this list?

YES! The e-mail system will let you unsubscribe at any time. Simply select the "SafeUnsubscribe" link that appears at the bottom on the PTA e-mail. Once you unsubscribe you will no longer receive our information. The system adds you to a global unsubscribe list that we cannot change unless you subscribe to our list again.
